APPENDIX A

1. Section 11.1(9) of the *Act*, provides that:

Orders prohibiting publication

11.1 (9) If the complaint involves allegations of sexual misconduct or sexual harassment, the panel shall, at the request of a complainant or of a witness who testifies to having been the victim of such conduct by the justice of the peace, prohibit the publication of information that might identify the complainant or witness, as the case may be. 2006, c. 21, Sched.
