Registering for a 6-month OPSGuest Wi-Fi account

Registration forms are available in both English and French for counsel and self-represented clients to request the 6-month OPSGuest Wi-Fi account. This account enables access to the OPSGuest Wi-Fi service in any of the 72 courthouses that have the service installed.

To complete an **online form** to request 6-month access, <u>click here</u>. Requests for alternative formats or assistance completing the application form can be directed to <u>wifi@ontario.ca</u>.

It can take up to 72 business hours for registration to be complete. Applicants must re-apply for an account prior to or after its expiry. There will be no warning message when an account is about to expire.

Applying for OPSGuest Wi-Fi (8-hour access only)

In some cases, the OPSGuest Wi-Fi service can also be used via a sponsored 8-hour account. It is recommended that counsel use the 6-month account application process to facilitate their court matters. The 8-hour access is an alternative that should only be used on the occasion that the 6-month account credentials are not available prior to your court date.
